Kiss and Drive

A few reminders about using this safely and efficiently:

Parents should not exit their vehicle. Students should get to the car themselves and enter/exit. This keeps the flow moving.

Parents should pull as far forward in the pickup line as possible to allow many students to be loaded safely at once.

Parents should **never** pull around parked cars to move ahead in line. This greatly increases the chances of an accident as other cars are not expecting this and some students have to load on the street side of their vehicles. Let's model patience and understanding for our students.

Parents should not park in the visitor parking to drop their children off at school or pick them up. Those spaces are reserved for visitors with business in the office.

Masks

Parents, please provide your student with masks from home. While we have some masks here at school, those are only for supplementing when needed (one gets wet, breaks, etc) and should not be seen as a daily mask supply. Please let our office know if you need cloth masks.

Veteran's Day

Is this Thursday! We will be honoring our veterans through a variety of classroom activities. As a school, we will be wearing red, white, and blue on Thursday, discussing the meaning of Veteran's Day together, and viewing a whole school compilation of veterans we know or who are in our families.
